



Positive Approach to Care: Getting Care Partners on Board

Helping families and professionals create calmer interactions, stronger connections, and better dementia care outcomes.

Positive Approach to Care (PAC), developed by Teepa Snow, offers practical, relationship-centered strategies that improve communication and reduce distress for people living with dementia and their care partners. This session will provide a concise review of core PAC principles and techniques while focusing on how healthcare professionals can effectively communicate the value of PAC approaches to family and professional care partners in brief, real-world interactions. Participants will explore strategies for increasing buy-in, addressing resistance, and encouraging adoption of PAC methods across care settings.

Participants will be able to:

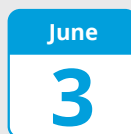
- Identify key principles and communication strategies associated with Positive Approach to Care (PAC).
- Describe how PAC techniques can improve interactions, reduce distress, and support positive outcomes for people living with dementia and their care partners.
- Demonstrate concise, effective ways to explain PAC methods and benefits to family and professional care partners.
- Discuss strategies for increasing care partner engagement and encouraging adoption of PAC approaches in everyday dementia care settings.
